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Baseball and Softball Restart

Jackson Township's Guidelines

Effective: May 26, 2020

1. Tournaments and League play: Jackson Township Trustees and the Park and Recreational Division reserve the right to impose additional standards above the baseball and softball guidelines issued by the Ohio Health Department. Additional standards may be imposed without notice.
2. Jackson Township Trustees and the Park and Recreational Division or its designee reserve the right to terminate a game or practice for non-compliance with the baseball and softball guidelines issued by the Ohio Health Department.
3. Tournaments: The organizer has a duty to notify the Stark County Health Department of the event, and provide proof of notification to Jackson Township. This can be achieved by going to Starkhealth.org and click on RestartStark.
4. Tournament organizer and League manager must ensure the following:
 - Coaches have read understand the baseball and softball guidelines issued by the Ohio Health Department.
 - Coaches at fields are responsible for health assessment for all participating players
 - Coaches at fields are responsible for enforcing social distancing of players, and spectators.
 - Coaches at fields are responsible for enforcing the wearing face coverings.
 - Coaches at fields are responsible for ensuring there is no spitting, eating seeds, gum or other similar products.
 - Coaches at fields are responsible for enforcing the "No Touch Rule".
5. Tournaments and League manager must ensure no shared drinking coolers, bottles or other similar devises. Township drinking fountains will remain closed. Township restrooms will be open.
6. Tournaments and League manager must ensure umpire and official's compliance the baseball and softball guidelines issued by the Ohio Health Department.
7. Tournament organizers and Leagues must provide the Township a waiver of liability for all its players, coaches and umpires holding the Township harmless from liability associated with exposure and/or contracting COVID-19.
8. Teams, leagues, and/or tournaments found to be in non-compliance with the Ohio Health Department's and Jackson Township's Guidelines maybe asked to vacate the field and/or have field permits revoked.
