Be it further resolved, that all obligations of the Jackson Council of Governments shall transfer to the Board of Trustees of Jackson Township and the Board of Education of Jackson Local School District equally; and

Be it further resolved, that we hereby authorize the placement of our signatures upon the attached Service Agreement with the Board of Education of Jackson Local School District. **3-0 yes**

**New Business**

Gonzalez said it was quite a tragedy what happened with the Sheriff's Office. He said he received a communication from the Sheriff complimenting Chief Brink and our department for reaching out to assist. He said 'what a tragedy it is at this time of year to lose a man like that.'

**Public Speaks – Open Forum**

Chuck Bruce, 5885 Heather St. N.W., said there is a project going on at Greenwich where they are digging an area up and putting drain pipes in. He said it looks like that are going into the dead end and back to the golf course to put a retention pond in. He said for two years they were told there was no flooding issue there. He asked if there was something in the works that has caused this project to start.

Hawke said there were some pictures that people from the neighborhood took and had voiced concern. He said the Trustees asked the Stark County Engineer to look into it and part of this project is what they felt was necessary to alleviate the situation.

Mr. Bruce said they were glad that it was there.

Mr. Boger said the Stark County Engineer made an agreement that they would do all the work at this site if the Township provided the pipe. He said that is quite an improvement for that allotment.

Mr. Bruce said they appreciate this being done.

Richard Stockton, 3344 Trillium, said referring to Chuck's comments about the drainage pipe and the labor that has gone into it and it is greatly appreciated. He said he lives in the Springfield development where there are around 40 or 42 homes. He said every one of those homes is on county sewer except one and that one is his. He asked if there was some way a

homeowner could be helped in getting a sewer line put in or having it put in at the County's or Township's expense.

Boger said the answer would be no but the Stark County Metropolitan Sewer District would be more able to answer his question.

Vaccaro said there is a program that the Stark County Health Department runs to hook households up to sewer. He said he wasn't sure of the qualifications but recommended he start there.

Gonzalez said he would have to pay for everything and then pay a tap charge which is based on how many feet of pipe was run.

Hawke moved and Pizzino seconded a motion to adjourn.
